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PROJECT SUMMARY:

The Hoopa Career and Technical Education Program (HCATEP) will provide services to students on the Hoopa Valley Indian Reservation and surrounding areas. The project will increase employment and entrepreneurship in the private sector and Tribal enterprises, as well as in early childhood education, constructions and modular home manufacturing, health occupations, natural resource management and other existing and emerging professions and occupations.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

- To enroll students at least 40 full-time and 20 part-time students in specialized certificate programs; to enroll 40 full-time and 20 part-time students in Early Childhood Education Programs; to enroll 40 full-time and 20 part-time students in Liberal Studies AA/AS degrees preparatory to emerging careers, and achieve an annual retention and graduation rate of 67%. 80% of these students completing their courses each year will be placed in employment. The HCATEP will further enroll 20 Tribal employees per year in a Tribal Managers Certificate program at one course per semester for a total of 18 units.
- To provide comprehensive career guidance and counseling services to at least 200 Indian students enrolled in the four HACTEP career/technical education programs. The HCATEP will also provide text books, mileage vouchers, and tutoring to all eligible participants. Stipends will be provided to 30 eligible participants per year and child care will be provided on a limited basis.
