Mandatory Collection Regulations

Final Regulations – January 25, 2007

Effective – SY 2006-07 Data for *EDFacts*

34 CFR 76.720 failure to comply substantially

Mandatory Data Collection

76.720(c) State reporting requirements

(1) A **State must submit** these reports in the manner prescribed by the Secretary, **including** submitting any of these reports **electronically** and at the quality level specified in the data collection instrument.

Transmission of Data to EDEN


For many SEAs, the State's Information System consists of several "systems."

SEA's Information System



These unique systems require different approaches to map the data to the EDEN Standard.


Mapping Approaches



While generic tools can be developed to build the transmittal files, the inputting or mapping of the source data remains unique to each state.

EDEN will utilize at least four transfer protocols.

Transfer Protocols



The result will be **one standard** set of data for each of the 52 SEAs in the EDEN Data Repository.

An EDEN Standard will not only allow for an enterprise solution at ED but can also enable States to develop similar capacity at their level.

What's *EDFacts*?

EDFacts centralizes performance data supplied by K-12 state education agencies (SEAs) with other data assets, such as financial grant information, within the Department to enable better analysis and use in policy development, planning and management.

Purposes of *EDFacts*

- Place the use of robust, timely performance data at the core of decision and policymaking in education.
- Reduce state and district data burden and streamline data practices.
- Improve state data capabilities by providing resources and technical assistance.
- Provide data for planning, policy, and management at the federal, state, and local levels.

Levels of Data Reporting

All data elements: (CTE is included here)

- State education agencies (SEA)
- Local education agencies (LEA)

Few data elements:

- Schools
